Learning Grid

 Here is an overview of what the children will be learning in Autumn 1.

### Kingfisher Hall Learning Grid: Autumn 1, Year 4

Force for positive change: Food donations to the Felix Project and help organise food parcels for families who need extra support during the lead up to Christmas.



#### Maths

Children will be exploring the following this term:

- · Number Place Value
- Number Addition & Subtraction
- Number Multiplication & Division

Math

Geometry - 2D Shapes

Children will continue to develop their problem solving skills through investigations.

#### English

Through the text of 'Mr Stink' by David Walliams, the children will focus on reading skills and the following writing genres:

- Diary Entry
- Newspaper Report

Children will be orally reciting text an using a variety of sentence structures conjunctions and punctuation.

#### Science: States of matter







In this unit, pupils will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

They will investigate how some materials change state when they are beated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C). They will plan enquiries to identify the part

played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

#### ART - Collage

Taking inspiration from Mile Hipplyte, who is a French paper designer and illustrator, children will explore a range of paper cutting and folding techniques to use in a 3d collage.

### PHSE: Being Me, My World

Children be able to explain why being listened to and listening to others is important in the school community. They will also look at why why being democratic is important to help feel valued. Children will problem solve and offer different solutions to help their team/ class/ school be more democratic.

#### RE: Judaism

This term the children will be learning about a key festival of the Jewish faith; Sukkot, the special relationship that Jews have with God, the importance of Abraham and special symbols to them.

#### Physical Education:

Indoor: Net/Wall games Use a wide range of throwing, catching and hitting skills, on both sides of their body with accuracy and consistency.

Outdoor: Outdoor and Adventurous activities. Use maps and diagrams to orientate themselves and to travel around a simple course



## Home Learning Expectations



• Homework will now be set on DB Primary with alternating weeks of Maths and English. There will be no more homework books sent home.

- Children are expected to be reading everyday with an adult and write a comment in their reading record. Their reading record will be checked everyday by the class teacher.
- Children will be given the year 3- 4 statutory spelling list in their reading record to work on at home over the year.
- Children are required to practice their times table every day as times tables are fundamental to support them with the Year 5 and 6 Curriculum.
- The national times table check is a test for all year four pupils that takes place from Monday 5 June 2023.

# Attendance and Punctuality

- We believe that regular attendance is clearly linked to pupils making good progress in their learning.
- It ensures that pupils settle into school and experience the stability and security they need in order to achieve their best.
- At a minimum we expect children to be in school for 96% of the time. This can still equate to 8 days of learning missed.
- If your child's attendance drops down to below 90%, this means almost 4 weeks of lost learning!
