This term, year 3 pupils will be writing letters of hope to the children of Great Ormond Street Hospital. The aim of these letters are to bring light and joy to the lives of vulnerable and sick children and to share our values of friendship, kindness and resilience.

This term the children will looking at number and place value. Children will be taught to recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number. (Hundreds, tens and ones). In addition this term, they will be looking at arithmetic and building their skills for quick multiplication and related division facts	This term the children will be using a core text as a stimulus for writing. The texts 'The Journey' and 'Counting on Katherine' will be shared through our class reading sessions, building on children's reading skills of inference, clarification and retrieval. The books will also be used as a stimulus for writing the following genres setting description and diary entry with a grammar focus on time conjunctions, expanded noun phrases, past tense and a range of punctuation.	In this unit children will be looking at the following: Family roles and responsibilities, Friendship and negotiation, keeping safe online and who to go to for help. Being a global citizen, Being aware of how my choices affect others, awareness of how other children have different lives, Expressing appreciation for family and friends	In this unit the children will recognize that they need light in order to see things and that darkness is the absence of light. The will learn that shadows are formed when light from a light source is blocked by a solid object.
Computing- Keychain computing system: Children will develop their understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. They also compare digital and non-digital devices. They will be introduced to computer networks, including devices that make up a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches.	Music Children will be exploring music through different genres and instrument families. They will be having a weekly music lesson that will focus on pulse, rhythm, tempo and dynamics. ### Attendance and Punctuality



- We believe that regular attendance is clearly linked to pupils making good progress in their learning.
- It ensures that pupils settle into school and experience the stability and security they need in order to achieve their best.
- At a minimum we expect children to be in school for 96% of the time. This can still equate to 8 days of learning missed.
- If your child's attendance drops down to below 90%, this means almost 4 weeks of lost learning!
